### OBITUARY

#### Fred B. Newcombe

The death of Mr. Fred B. Newcombe took place very suddenly at Kentville on Friday evening. He was participating in the degree work of Hiawatha Lodge and had just completed one of his parts when he sat down in a chair and passed peacefully away. Medical aid was summoned but death had come instantaneously.

Mr. Newcombe was a man most intimately connected with every interest of the town. He was President, Councillor, Chairman of the School Board, for several years, Warden of St. James' Church and a prominent member of Hiawatha Lodge, I. O. O. F., Hiawatha Band, etc. He was indefatigable in his work for the advancement of the towns interests and business affairs.

He was born at Cornwallis, son of the late D. B. Newcombe, July 28th, 1856. He leaves a sorrowing wife and one daughter, Violet, a younger brother, E. B. Newcombe, member of the firm. He received his early business training with the firm of R. H. White & Co., Boston. He came to Kentville and engaged with the firm of Beckwith & Dodge and over 25 years ago started in business for himself in what has proved to be one of the largest business enterprises of the town.

The funeral service held first at the residence, Monday morning and at 10.30 the body was removed to St. James' Church where it was viewed by a large number of friends. At three o'clock service was held in the church conducted by Rev. T. C. Mellor. Members of the Town Council attended in a body and the Oddfellows, a very large number in regalia. Rev. Archdeacon Martell preached the funeral sermon which was an eloquent and touching tribute to the deceased on the fighting of a good fight and the time of departure being at hand.

The funeral cortege was as follows: Hiawatha Band, Oddfellows, Clergy. Pallbearers, Hearse, Mourners, Mayor and Town Council and Vestrymen, Children of the public schools citizens etc.
