At the head of both our Public schools we have two of the finest principals I have ever had anything to do with, and a staff of excellent teachers under them. I am a mother, who has had six children attend the Public schools of Winnipeg, Brantford and Toronto, and found the teachers in the schools in these places noble men and women, but I had to come to Chatham and our Central school to see a school managed along almost perfect lines. Most of us parents find our hearts full of gratitude towards our most respected principal.
