CANADA APPLE LEADS

The autumnal "apple war", which during recent years has taken the place of the Victorian contest about the "big gooseberry", seems to have set in early and with great severity, but neither the 20-ounce Kent apple nor the slightly larger Essex rival comes near the "record". A specimen of Gloria Mundi, a big Herefordshire cooking apple, which weighed 37 1-2 ounces, was sold seven years ago at Covent Gardens for sixteen guineas. But the "world's record" for large apples is still held by the variety of Spokane Beauty a specimen of which, weighing thirty-eight ounces, was exhibited at the first Canadian apple show in 1910. It was grown on rough land in British Columbia without special cultivation.
