A Pioneer of Glassville Passes Away

Mrs. Elspeth McKenzie, after a brief sickness of two days, passed away at Glassville on Monday, June 11. On Saturday she was stricken with paralysis. Had she lived a month longer she would have celebrated her 87th birthday. Born in Huntly, Aberdeenshire, Scotland, she came to New Brunswick in July 1861. With her husband she settled in Aberdeen Parish in November of that year. Being possessed of a strong mentality and of many natural gifts, she made a deep impression upon those of her generation. She was one of the founders of the Aberdeen Baptist church at Highlands and had a large part in the building of the meeting-house. The building, long closed, was opened for the funeral service on Wednesday, and the sermon based on John 10:10 was preached by the Baptist minister of the field. Interment was made in the adjoining God's acre. She is survived by her son, Roderic, of the C. P. R. staff at McAdam Junction and Murdock living at the Forks of the Miramichi; also by three daughters, Mrs. Allan Hopkins of Seattle, Wash., Mrs. Jerry Durham, Ore., and Mrs. Joseph Nixon of Glassville. Her husband, Murdock McKenzie, died at the age of 21 years ago.

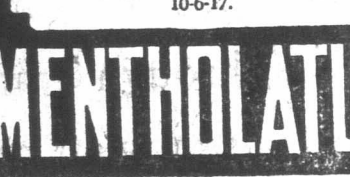

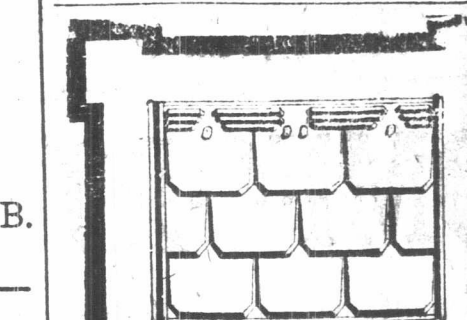
