



## CANADIANS SURE TO WIN HOCKEY TITLE

Play Sweden Today—Czechoslovakia and United States Out.

(Associated Press by Leased Wire.)  
Antwerp, April 26.—Canada and Sweden will meet in the ice palace here tonight in a game which will determine the Olympic hockey championship. France and the United States were eliminated for first place honors yesterday, the former by losing to Sweden by a score of 4 to 0 and the latter by going down to a 2 to 0 defeat before the Falcons of Canada, after a stirring contest. That Canada will win the championship seems certain, as the Swedish team has little hope except to hold the Falcons to a low score.

Under the Olympic rules, all teams directly beaten by the champion team must compete for second prize. Thus, the United States, Czechoslovakia and the loser of tonight's game will draw for opponents following that contest.

The American team was disappointed, but not chagrined, at its defeat by Canada last night.

"It was anybody's game until near the finish," said Manager Fellows, "but the best team won."

One hockey expert declared Europe had "never seen a game equal to it."

The Winnipeg Falcons team defeated Czechoslovakia, 15 to 0, Saturday.

## EVERETT SCOTT TO ESTABLISH RECORD

Boston Americans' Shortstop Will Play His 534th Consecutive Game.

(Associated Press by Leased Wire.)  
Boston, April 26.—Everett Scott, crack shortstop of the Boston Americans, will break all major league records for playing in consecutive games when he takes the field against the Athletics at Philadelphia today. With today's game Scott will have participated in 534 consecutive league contests. Luderus, of the Philadelphia Nationals set the record at 533 games last season, but he has not played this year.

Scott started his continuous playing on June 29, 1916, with the Red Sox, and he has not missed a game since. Actually Scott had previously outstripped Luderus through participation in eleven world series games in two years, but these post season contests have not been considered in the consecutive records for regular games.

The Boston shortstop has to his credit also for two years what is said to be the highest fielding average for any shortstop playing the full season in either major league. His mark of .976 made in both 1918 and 1919 is the highest on record. "Tuck" Turner's average of .973 in 1910 being the best previously made in the American League, and .968, Joe Tinker's record at short for Cincinnati, being the best in the National League.

## WHEATON LEADS LOCAL BOWLERS

Had Best Average of Local Team in Tournament but Calais Team Led.

One of the results of the victory of the Fredericton team in the bowling tournament at St. John last week is that the 1921 tournament will be held at the Palace Alleys in this city.

Under the regulations the winners of the silver pin donated by the Brunswick-Balke-Collender Company as emblematic of the championship of the Maritime Provinces and Eastern Maine defend the honors at their home alleys and thus next year's tournament will be held here.

Statistics which have been compiled for the tournament show the Calais team had the largest pinfall, averaging 1,446 in their five strings, while J. Casey of the Calais team had the highest pinfall with an average of 100 4-15. Gillespie of the Calais team just noting out Murray Kierstead of the Fredericton team for the highest individual single string with his score of 127 in the final game.

The Fredericton team, although winning the championship, were fourth in the total pinfall with an average of 1,405 in their five strings, while Jimmie Wheaton upset the hope of many of the critics by leading the Fredericton team with the highest average pinfall, his record of 96 2-15 being the best made by the locals. 
