RUSSIAN TROOPS ARE DESPATCHED TO PERSIA

Great Britain and Russia Assume Manoeuvre Concerning Persian Affairs—Americans Have Taken Over Administration of Persian Government.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 15.—As no reply has been received from the Persian government in regard to the Russian ultimatum of Nov. 11, it is officially announced that the government has ordered the immediate dispatch of troops to Persia.

They will be concentrated for the present at Kasvin, also Kasvin, 90 miles north of Teheran.

Russia and Great Britain, who have clearly recognized zones or territories in Persia, in their actions have assumed the mantle of protector of the Persian empire.

At least, it was such until the advent of Morgan W. Shuster, and his American colleagues, who have taken over the administration of the Persian government.

Later, the former occupant of the throne has not made much progress in his campaign for restoration, and it is over the property of his brother that the present dispute has its beginning.

The ex-Shah's brother supported his claim in the fighting, and the Persian government decided to confiscate his property, which task was delegated to the treasury agents.

The home government took up the case of the consul and demanded reparation from Persia, which up to the present time has not been granted.
