Hon. Mr. Fisher's Statement Concerning Visit to Washington.

Ottawa, March 12 .- The Hon. Sidney Fisher makes the following state-ment concerning the negotiations with the United States Government






Chicago Laundry Girls Killed in Terrible Boiler Explosion

It is stated that about 30 girls, and between 50 and 60 male employes were buried in the ruins, which immediately took fire. Twelve girls were dragged from the wreck-age before the fire broke out.
