## USED AXE ON HIM

They wrestled all over the bedroom for some time, but Johansen could not get the axe away from Talley, and when John Farman, living next door, who had been attracted by the noise, arrived on the scene, Johansen was nearly ex-

hausted from loss of blood. After he had been subdued the desperate man seemed to come to his enses for a time and begged the people around him to kill him with the axe. Later he was taken to the hospital. The wife, when the husband was taken before her, told the police that he was a good, kind husband, and Mrs. Johansen said she did not want him severely punished, as he had been very good to her.
