Miss Bessie Connel, of Detroit, is a visitor at the home of R. E. Lenax.

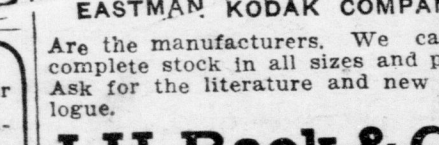
Mrs. Manning, of Port William, is visiting her parents, Mr. and Mrs. D. McKee.
