FIGHTING FOR PASS

PETROGRAD, Nov. 30.—The new Russian offensive in the Carpathians has resulted in considerable gains, it is announced officially. Heavy fighting is proceeding for possession of the important pass through the Carpathians at Kirlibaba.

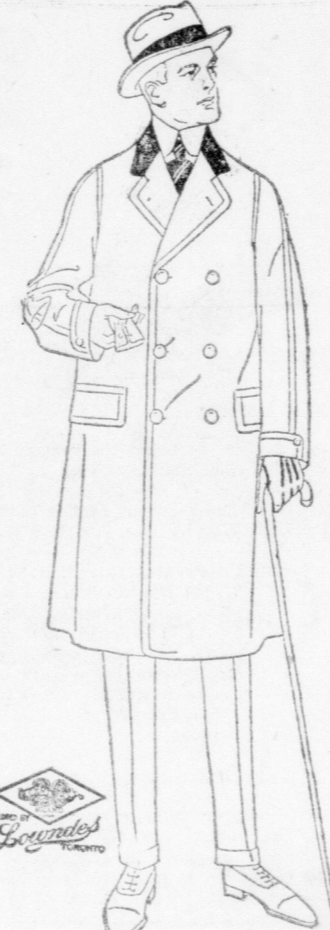
NO MORE SYMPTOMS OF DREAD DISEASE

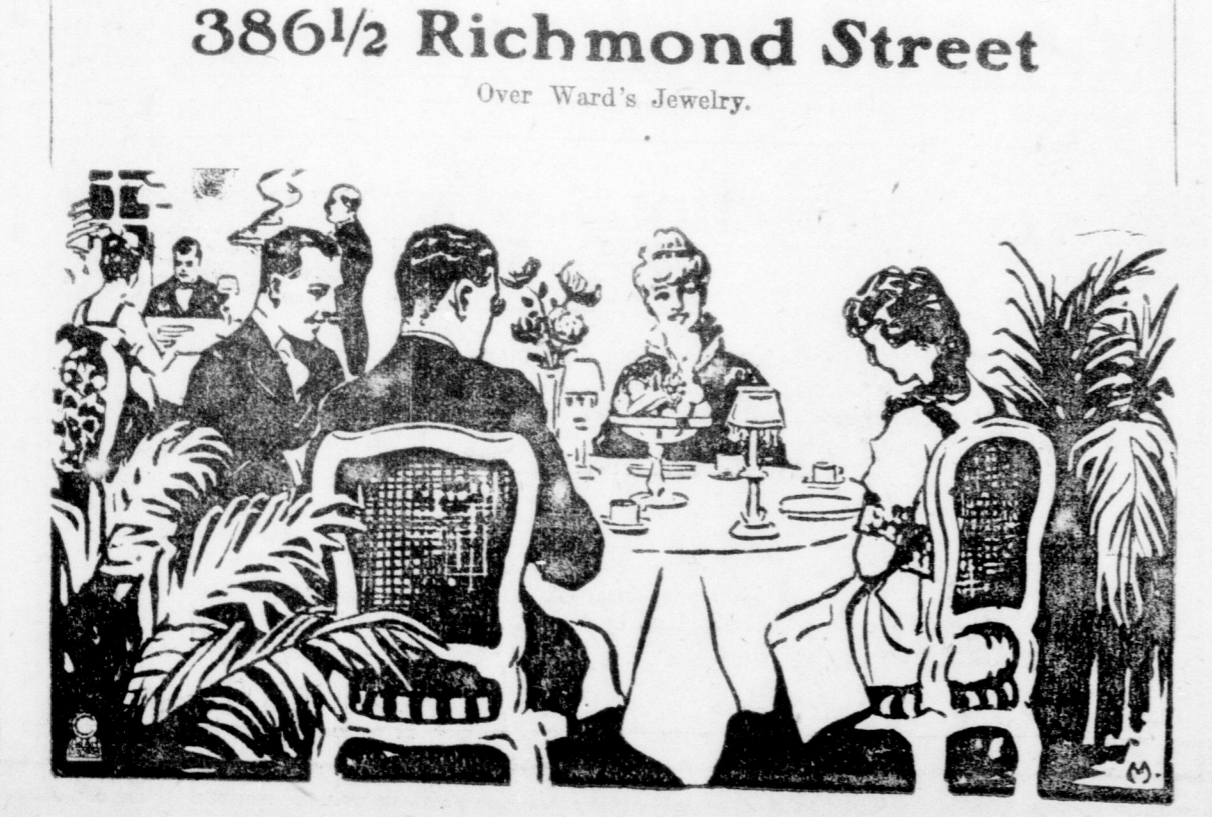
TURK TRANSPORT TAKEN BY RUSS
