THE TRUNK SEWER.

Engineer Keating's scheme will be considered To-day. The last meeting of the present Committee on Works will be held this afternoon. Engineer Keating's report regarding the proposed high and low level intercepting sewers will be submitted. The estimated cost, as already announced, is \$1,150,000 and the annual cost of pumping \$8000.

The total length of both high and low level sewers will be over 13 miles. The proposed intercepting sewer will be laid in a direct line to the foot of Balmawater-avenue, where it will be connected with the low-level sewer at the Woodbine, thereby slightly reducing the lift of the low-level sewer, and altering the position of the main outfall sewer by connecting the high and low level sewers at the Woodbine, and thence in a southeasterly direction, under water, and to the point of discharge, opposite Victoria Park.

A rumor was circulated that an error had been discovered in his report of last week, which shows a small increase instead of a decrease. If this error was really made, it may explain the higher prices for lower grades, some of which sold to-day from 10 to 15 cents higher than yesterday. The market close fairly firm under a good deal of buying by local buyers.
