

London, Jan. 2 .- All of the papers here contain kable despatches about the arrival at Halifax yesterday of H.M.S. Slenheim with the remains of Sir John Thompson. Sad and tragic though it was, it is generally felt here that the death of the late Canadian Premier will have the effect of creating new

bonds of sympathy between Canada and Great Britain, and will bring the two countries closer together than any event (which has happened in recent ears, while the expressions of symathy which have come from all parts the empire shows that the sorrows, well as the joys, of one portion it are beginning to be shared by the rest of the countries and dominions

The High Commissioner is taking the greatest pos-sible care of himself, and there is every reason to believe that he will soon re-gain his usual health.

Canada and the Cape.

Canada and the Cape. It is understood that Premier Rhodes of the Cape of ood Hope is much im-pressed with the results of the recent Ottawa: Conference, and is dispos-ed, so far as his colony is concerned, to carry them a step further. He would like very much to see closer commercial relations between Canada and the Cape and all the other colonies, and is reported to be not adverse to taking the matter up in the broadest possible way. According to recent ad-vices from the Cape the question of tempine and that colony is receiving considerable attention. The matter has been sibmitted by Sir Gordon Sprigg to the Chambers of Commerce throughout the country for an expression of opinion, and if it is fovorable there is little doubt that the matter will make another step
