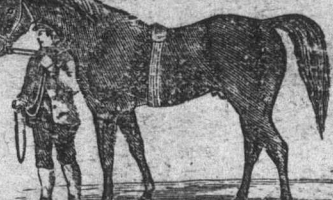

Donald C. McIntyre, aged 70, known as the "grand old man of the Great Lakes," for thirty-five years general freight traffic manager of the Detroit and Cleveland Navigation Company, died at Cleveland two weeks ago. He was a native of Alvinston and was 70 years old.

The Glencoe public library board have decided to avail themselves of the opportunity to secure a Carnegie Library for Glencoe. It is understood that the Grand Trunk Railway Company will grant a site for the building on their property cornering on Main and McRae streets.

A pretty wedding took place at high noon on Tuesday, June 20, in Wortley road Baptist church London, when Gwenilian Mariani, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Hughes, 207 Wortley road, was united in marriage to the Rev. Leslie Stone of Wyoming. The Rev. N. S. McKechnie, pastor of the church, officiating.

Petrol's celebration on Dominion Day was a complete success. An interesting program was presented and the games and contests keenly contested. Thirty horses were entered for the races. G. Hollingsworth's Nellie O took third prize in the three minute race.

The West Middlesex U. F. O. picnic at Strathroy on Dominion Day was a big success, an attendance of 12,000 being estimated. The program of races and games was faithfully carried out and the community dance in the evening was much enjoyed. The proceeds of the day were divided between the Strathroy hospital and rest room and the U. F. O. It was a day long to be remembered.

Mrs. John Logan, living on the Blind Line, north-east of Petrol, took her life by drowning herself in a small creek near her home Monday morning about 9 o'clock. The body was not found until 11 o'clock after a general search by her husband and neighbors. The body was eventually found in a deep hole in the creek. Mrs. Logan had been in ill-health for some time and had made other attempts to commit suicide. Beside her husband she leaves a family of six children, all under 12 years of age.

James H. Chivers Sarnia, was badly burned about the face, hands and arms at 11.30 Thursday morning while working at the experimental still of the test house of Imperial Oil Limited. He was rushed to the Sarnia general hospital where the burns were found to be of a serious and extended nature. Dr. C. O. Young attended the injured man. Mr. Chivers, who is a married man with four children was working at the still when some oil, issued by the worm end was ignited by the firebox in the still. The flames flared out and caught Mr. Chivers face and set his clothing afire. He was alone at the time but managed to crawl on his hands and knees to the open air. A number of his fellow workmen rushed to his assistance and the burning clothing was quickly extinguished.

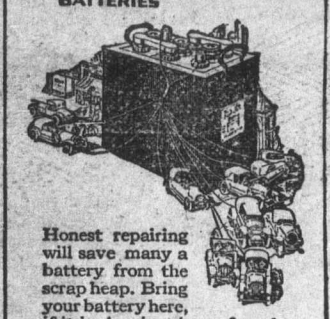
