stitute influence. The school is a special object of interest. Sanitary conditions in the community, the beautifying of the community, providing playgrounds for children and older boys and girls, community halls, community singing and entertainments, the care of the sick, the poor and the needy, building sidewalks. aring for the cemeteries and many kindred retivities make the Institute a live force in the community.

From the community the influence radiates out through the country and he Province. The Institutes are working for the comfort of those who are in the hospitals and the county homes. The Infart's Home, in Hallfax, has rather a special place in the hearts of the Institute members and many are the garments, the barre's of apples and vegetables, jars of jam and other gifts which are sent from the Institutes to this institution. An interest is also taken in the Institute for the blind and the orders which are sen for brooms help the blind who are learning to help themselves.
