The U.S. tariff on Portland cement is 22¢/t including the weight of the container. All other cements are duty free. Under the Free Trade Agreement Portland Cement would become duty free on January 1, 1989.

Tariff Impacts of Free Trade

U.S. tariffs for the products in this sector are widely varied as they serve many different industries. Chemical intermediates for perfumes, cosmetics or toilet preparations carry tariffs of 6% or 6.3% or if by weight, 11¢/kg plus 4.9% or 4.7%. Preparations for use in the textile industry are levied 6% while those for the paper industry are levied 12%. The maximum tariff in this sector is 18%. All duties are to be removed by January 1, 1993 under the Free Trade Agreement.
