A brief, well-organized collection covering a formative period of recent Canadian foreign policy.

8. <u>International Journal</u> (Toronto, Canadian Institute of International Affairs, quarterly, 1946-)

Canada's leading journal on international affairs, with many articles on Canada's foreign policy. Each issue is devoted to one subject, e.g. the Commonwealth, economic interdependence, a region, etc.

9. <u>International Perspectives</u> (Ottawa, Department of External Affairs, bi-monthly, 1972-)

The Department's journal, with informative contributions from persons inside and outside the Department. Lively personal views on Camda's role expressed; an attractively-produced magazine.

10. International Canada (Ottawa, Canadian Institute of International Affairs, 1970-)

Begun in 1962 as <u>Monthly Report on Canadian External Relations</u>, this is a monthly summary of Canada's activities in international affairs drawn from government sources and Canadian newspapers.

11. <u>Canada in World Affairs</u> (Toronto, Oxford University Press for the Canadian Institute of International Affairs, 1941-)

A series sponsored by the Canadian Institute of International Affairs with each volume discussing the course of Canadian external relations over a two-year period. Twelve volumes have now (1976) been issued, covering the years since the late 1930's to 1963. Not all volumes are in print.
