Mr. Darroch: Mr. Chairman, as a little man from what was described this afternoon as a little riding, and who has taken up little time of the house, I wish to say a few words with respect to this constituency.

Let me state quite emphatically, after listening to suggestions as to what had taken place in Ontario caucuses that I never was in an Ontario Liberal caucus where redistribution was discussed. I would also bear out what was said by the hon. member for Ottawa West, that any time we did discuss this matter we were the only persons in his office. There have been some hints that what was said by the hon. member was not correct, and I wish to state at once that so far as I am concerned his statement was correct.

The problem confronting the committee in connection with this riding was that they had to consider the county of Huron with 49,280, Perth with 52,434 and Wellington with 66,930. I have no illusions whatsoever as to what would have happened to these counties if the redistribution had been carried out by a commission.

I have listened with interest to the many able speeches regarding having this work done by a commission, and perhaps what I shall now say will be somewhat out of order. I take this opportunity, however, to trespass slightly on the rules to the extent of commenting briefly on the speeches of the leader of the opposition and those of the distinguished and eloquent members from Eglinton and Greenwood, as well as their junior partner, the hon. member for Broadview. When they were speaking I could not help wondering what effect this bill would have on the activities of the premier of Ontario when the next redistribution in that province takes place.

Mr. Murphy: What has that to do with it?
