I probably should apologize to the Minister of Labour because unfortunately I was not aware at the time that he was not here and was not represented in the house. Probably he has been informed of my question in the meantime. I should like to bring to his attention, to the attention of the government and of this house the fact that although we are under the impression that these claims for benefit are met promptly in the various offices across this country, such is not the case.

Mr. Speaker, I do not intend to encroach upon the time of this house further. I realize that my time is up and I think I have made my point. I ask the Minister of Labour to take this matter into consideration.
