

CONFIDENCE LOST IN B.C. UNIVERSITY HEAD

VANCOUVER, April 6 — (C. P.) — University of British Columbia's senate has passed a resolution expressing non-confidence in President L. S. Klinck. The resolution was passed by a vote of 18 to seven at a meeting held here last night.

The resolution declared "the senate regrets that it has lost confidence in the president of the university, and feels that the best interests of the university cannot be served under his leadership."

The passing of the non-confidence motion culminates a series of differences between the senate and the board of governors on the handling of the university administration.
