6th June, 1930. Mr. Gordon H. Heslam. state, however, that Miss Ramsay whom you had in mind as a Lecturer will probably be in Great Britian next summer, as she intends to visit some training centres. Probably, therefore, she will not be available. I feel that if this summer school is to be a success, the first thing to do is to arrange for its financial support, and then choose the subjects, and Lecturers who would be most favoured by teachers. I also think the school should be a serious endeavour, and not a mere holiday in congenial surroundings. I am also sending a copy of this letter to Sir Arthur Currie. Yours faithfully, KC. Dean.
