

Traders Caught Short of Pearl Lake--McIntyre Begins to Move

CATTLE MARKET REMAINS STEADY

Sheep, Lambs, Calves and Hogs Steady at Firm Prices.

Receipts of live stock were 83 car loads, comprising 571 cattle, 991 hogs, 83 sheep and lambs, 87 calves and 54 horses.

Trade in cattle was fairly active, with prices firm for all desirable steers and heifers, and a few cows advanced for demand, those sold at 25c to 30c per cwt.

As usual the receipts of sheep, lambs and calves were light and prices firm. A moderate supply of hogs sold at \$9.50 to \$9.60, fed and watered.

Export Cattle. About two car loads of cattle of export weight and quality sold at \$6.75 to \$6.90 per cwt., and seven cattle sold by Coughlin & Co., weighing 1,200 lbs., brought \$7.10.

Butchers. Choice picked butchers sold at \$4.25 to \$4.75; loads of good, \$5.00 to \$5.25; medium, \$4.25 to \$4.75; cows, \$3 to \$5.25 for the bulk, but a very few extra choice heavy cows sold at \$5.50 to \$5.60; bulls, common to choice, sold at \$3.75 to \$5.40; canner cows, \$2.50 to \$2.75.

Stockers and Feeders. Stockers, 500 to 750 lbs., were quoted at \$4.50 to \$5.15; feeders, 800 to 1,000 lbs., at \$4.25 to \$5.45.

Milkers and Springers. The market for milkers and springers has been about stationary for several weeks past. The supply was again light, but quite equal to the demand. Enquiry was centered largely on the good to choice kinds, and most of the selling was from \$5 to \$7. Common and medium are selling from \$4 to \$4.50 and \$4.50 to \$5.00.

Live Calves. Receipts of calves were light; good to choice vealers sold from \$9.50 to \$10; fair to good, light vealers, \$8.75 to \$9; strong weight vealers, \$8.75 to \$9.25; inferior, rough, heavy calves, at \$4 to \$5.50.

Sheep and Lambs. Receipts of sheep and lambs were light and nearly all of poor quality. When the quality is taken into consideration the prices paid today were higher than at any previous time this season. Sheep, ewes, \$6.75 to \$7; rams, \$5.50 to \$6; lambs, \$4 to \$5; cull lambs, at \$3 to \$4.

Hogs. Receipts of hogs were moderate. Selects, fed and watered, sold at \$9.50 to \$9.60, and \$1.25, f.o.b., cars at country points.

MARKET NOTES

The Toronto packers have given notice that, effective on and after March 1913, they will not buy hogs "fed and watered" that have been fed other than a whole half grain and given water from time of unloading.

It is understood that if it is found necessary to change the relative price between "f.o.b." and "fed and watered" hogs, same will be adjusted as soon as proper tests are made.

The packers claim the "stuffing" of hogs on ground feed has made a position necessary, they suffering in the same way as when cattle were fed rolled oats.

Winnipeg Grain Market. The market for wheat and other grain in Winnipeg was light, a very light volume of business being transacted. Opening prices were stronger than in previous cables. Cash demand was good, but offerings were scarce. Oats in good demand and prices higher. Flax was weaker. Three hundred cars in sight for inspection.
