TREASURY HEADS IN QUANDARY OVER BILL

Provisions of New Tariff Law as to Reduction of Duties on Goods Imported in American Ships Causing Confusion—Twenty-Three Nations Are Involved.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 5.—(Can. Press.)—Officials of the treasury department are at sea to know what congress actually meant by the provision of the new tariff law allowing five per cent reduction of duties on goods imported in American ships, with the condition that the differential should not be construed to abrogate or impair any existing treaty between the United States and a foreign nation.

Literally interpreted it is declared the provision would give a five per cent decrease to goods in American bottoms and automatically grant the same privilege to the ships of the many nations whose treaties with the United States guarantee no discrimination between their vessels and those of this country.

Ex-Convict, Without Emotion, Tells of Murdering Two of His Four Wives, Seven Other Women, Two Policemen and Three Business Men.

CHICAGO, Oct. 5.—A man variously known as "Henry Spencer," "Skupala" and "Joseph Burke," an ex-convict, who was arrested last night, made a confession this evening to the police that he had killed Mrs. Mildred Allison, a Roxroat, a dancing teacher, whose dead body was found near Wayne, a suburb, for whose murder her husband has been held in jail for ten days.

NATIONAL FISCAL POLICY IS RESCUED

From the Grip of Privilege, Says the London Daily Mail, and Passage of New Tariff Bill Proves That the People Really Do Rule.

LONDON, Oct. 6.—(Can. Press.)—The Daily Mail in an editorial this morning thinks that both the American people, who anticipate a reduction in the high post of living from the new tariff act, and British manufacturers who imagine that it will open fresh and profitable markets for their goods, are alike destined to be disappointed, because customs duties are only one of the complex factors affecting prices, and the duties will still be generally high enough to preserve the bulk of the home market to American manufacturers.
