Declaration of an Officer of Major General Sir William Pepperell's late Regiment, who fent by Lieutenant Colonel Littlehales, manding Officer at Oswego, with a Flag of Truce to the Marquis de Montcalm commanding the French Forces at the taking of Oswego, and was by him detained as an Hostage, during the Ratification of the Capitulation, in the French Camp, viz.

HAT he heard the Marquis of Montcalm and several other French Officers declare, in the way of Discourse with him, that they took the Opportunity of the English Brigantine's being on Ground and the other Vessels being in Harbour to transport their Train of Artillery across the Bay in Battoes, which would have been next to impossible to have been brought any other way, as they afterwards found, owing to the Shore and the Situation of Fort Ontario, where they begun the Attack."
