RESOLVLD,

United States, as is already purchased, or shall be purchased, of the Indian inhabitants, and offered for sale by Congress, shall be divided into distinct states in the solutions manner, as nearly as such cessions will admit; that is to say, by parallels of latitude, so that each state shall comprehend from north to fouth two degrees of latitude, begining to count from the completion of sorty-sive degrees north of the equation; and by ineridians of longitude, one of which shall pass through the lowest point of the rapids of Ohio, and the other through the western cape of the mouth of the reat Kanhaway: but the territory eastward of this last meridian, between the Ohio lake size, and Penn Alvania, shall be one state, whatsoever may be its comprehension of latitude. That which may lie beyon the completion of the forty-sifth degree between the said meridians shall make part of the state adjoining it on the south; and that part of the Ohio, which is between the same meridians coinciding nearly with the parallel of thirty-nine degrees, shall be substituted so sat in lieu of that parallel as a boundary the.

That the fettlers on any territory so purchased and offered for sale, shall, either on the rown petrioner on the order of Congress, receive authority from them, with appointments of time and place, for their ee males of sull age, within the limits of their state, to meet together, for the purpose of establishing a emporary government, to adopt the constitution and laws of any one of the original states; so that such away nevertheless shall be subject to alteration by their ordinary legislature; and to creek, subject to a like station, counties, townships, or other divisions, for the election of members for their legislature.

That when any fuch state shall have acquired twenty thousand free inhabitants, on giving due proof nereof to Congress, they shall receive from them authority, with appointments of time and place, to call a provention of representatives, to establish a permanent constitution and government for themselves.
