CANADIAN FRUIT IS BOTH SCARCE AND DEAR

Raspberries Sell at 15c Wholesale - Lemons Also High -Market is Active.

Receipts on the local fruit market yes-

terday were not very neavy and everything sold at big prices, the market being practically cleaned up early in the afternoon. Whether due to the exceptionally dry season, the enormously increased demand, or whatever cause there is a lamentable lack of carly Canadian fruit available for the ordinary citizen these days. While it is all right for the grower Canadian raspberries ought not to be selling on the Toronto market-to-day wholesale at from 13c to 16c a box. Fruit is essential to good living, but the scarcity and high prices frighten the ordinary householder. There ought to be an unlimited field in the Niagara district and right around the city in the subject and York County for the biggest kind of money-making. Raspberries at 10c a box in an ordinary year would be a bonanza. If everybody had a half acre of strawberries and raspberries in the rural districts life would be worth living.

The hot dry weather has created an abnormal demand for lemons and the price has gone up 50 cents within 10 days. The scarcity of fruits is in a measure responsible for this. 
