J. C. Scott. ex-president of the board of trade. said there was a lot of labor unrest in Quebec. The high cost of living was the main cause of it. There was a good class of laborers in Quebec. He had employed 1.000 of them for 20 years and had never had any trouble with them. They were fully organized. There had been an increase of 103 per cent. in the cost of foodstuffs in the Quebec district. Some of the poor people could not now afford meat amd were living on potatoes and bread. Now bread was going up in price. He advocated control of the export of food.

Commissioner Riordan: "But would not that tend to diminish production?" The witness said he did not think so. He pointed to the enormous increase in production in wheat, oats, and barley in Quebec during the war as evidence of what the farmers could do.


