North Toronto. The chairman of the finance committee of the school board has a new way of scrutinizing accounts. Instead of reading them he passes them around to members and the ratepayers do not learn the amount, Arthur Beattie's resignation as caretaker for the Eglington School was accepted; also that of Miss French, a teacher of the school grounds, unless purchased by public subscription and if both schools would be benefited. Trustee LeCras, chairman of the management committee, advocated front and rear exits in a school with proper going in the lower hall of each building, for fire protection. The report was accepted.

St. Catharines, March 7.—(Special).—The St. Catharines Board of Trade's annual meeting adopted a resolution that as the Canadian Northern Railway has some 3000 miles of railway in the west, it was desirable that this system should be extended eastward and into cities and towns of Ontario, in order that manufacturers and merchants may more fully participate in the benefits of trade with Western Canada.

It was further resolved—that the governments of the Dominion and of the province should grant general assistance to the company in the construction of the line from Port Arthur easterly thru those districts which were not so thickly populated and thru which the line must necessarily be, so far as local traffic is concerned, a colonization road.

SASKATCHEWAN PROVIDES FOR ITS NEW UNIVERSITY

Bill, Which Has Received Its First Reading, Establishes Politic and Corporate Body.

Regina, Sask., March 7.—The University act, introduced by the provincial government for the purpose of establishing and incorporating a university, which has received its first reading, establishes a body politic and corporate consisting of a chancellor, a convocation, senate, board of government and council.

It is to give equal power and authority to give such instruction and to give such examinations to the senate and to examine candidates for degrees and for certificates of honor and to grant degrees after examination in the manner provided in the act.

No religious tests will be required of either professors or students, tho the act is given to any affiliated college to make such provisions in regard to religious instructions and worship as its own students as it may deem proper.

The maintenance of the university to be provided out of the general revenue of the province, and by a percentage of the net receipts of the province for the current year under the act, and by the proceeds of the sale of the fund collected by the Supplementary Act.

The real and personal property of the university is to be exempted from taxation.

SMELTER FOR PARRY SOUND

Town to Give \$100,000 Toward a Plant to Cost \$1,500,000.

Parry Sound, March 7.—The town council has made an agreement with the Dominion Smelters, Limited, for the erection of a \$1,500,000 custom smelter here. The plant is to have a capacity of 1000 tons a day and to employ 400 men.

It is connected with a large independent smelter in the town of Mattice.

The town grants aid to the extent of \$100,000.

ENGINEERS ARE ANXIOUS.

Will Ask the Government to Eliminate Some Sections of Bill.

Some of the stationary engineers fear that the new government bill requiring examinations and licenses will interfere with their positions and the trades council was last night asked to assist in making representations to the government with a view to having some features of the act eliminated.

The plan of Hon. Mr. Hanna to establish a convict-farm was approved.

The educational committee recommended that fire extinguishers be placed in the schools.

The offer of the Salvation Army to supply Canadian manufacturers with skilled laborers was not favored, as it was feared the new arrivals would be used for strike-breaking.
