Walker of the Bank o Commerce recently presented to the university his magnificent collection of more than 10,000 geological specimens and six hundred and forty-five volumes and many pamphlets dealing with geology and palaeontology, and yesterday the board of governors, thru their chairman, Dr. John Hoskin, expressed their appreciation of this gift in the form of a beautifully illuminated address, which in part read: "The sum of his donations now co




