outs to corporations it brings in a bill and asks us to pass it under closure. Nothing in this bill will solve any of the unfairnesses in our society.

We have a system at the present time under which certain persons, between the ages of 60 and 65 receive a spouse's allowance, but for spinsters, widows, bachelors and widowers there is no such allowance, and there is nothing for them in the bill. There is nothing in it to straighten out the government's finances so that the promise to increase the basic pension for veterans may be met. There is nothing in the bill to improve the position of the working poor, those for whom a guaranteed annual income is supposed to be on the drawing board.

What is the hurry to pass this bill, Mr. Speaker? It is not a ticket to the millennium. It is a bill that will take us in reverse. That is why I join with others in saying this closure motion should not be supported by this House of Commons which is supposed to be part of a democratic parliament.

There is one other reason why I am opposed to this closure motion and to all closure motions. They never go to the heart of the problem. The only way the government knows to deal with extended debate in the House of Commons is to cut it off—to deny it. Surely the time has come to find a better way of arranging the debates in this House so that we can deal with things on a proper basis. All the government does is close off debate. That means it is not even prepared to look at the proper ways of improving the procedures of this House.
