This committee desire gratefully to acknowledge the contribution of £1000 sterling from the S. P. G. towards a fund for the Endowment of the Church in this Diocese, and to express a hope that this proffered liberality may stimulate to renewed efforts for the above object.

The Executive Committee feel assured that all will unite in acknowledging the loss we have met with by the death of the late Sir Brenton Halliburton, Chief Justice of this Province.

As a V. P. of this Society since its establishment in 1837 he always took the deepest interest in its welfare, and testified his regard by the prudence of his counsels in its guidance and the liberality of his donations in its support.

His firmness of principle, his integrity of life, and his piety of heart, adorned with true christian charity for all men, present a bright example for future generations.
