

APRIL.

The same weather which distinguished the latter days of last month will continue until the 2d, when cold winds, accompanied by rain will set in, and continue, with frequent cessations, until the 16th, when the weather will become steady and temperate, and will continue so until the 18th, when changeable weather will again set in—sometimes wind and rain—sometimes fair, with soft temperate weather, and again clear and cold with frosts at night. On the 25th a heavy fall of snow will take place. These alternate changes will distinguish all the latter part of April. On the morning of the 1st, at 5 minutes after 4, will fall a most awful shower of meteors.
