In issuing the Annual Report of the contributions of our people in aid of our Missions, the Missionary Board desires, in the spirit of the Gospel of Christ, to say a few earnest and faithful words to the lovers and promoters of the Missionary operations of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Canada.

In the first place, let us all be profoundly and continually grateful to God for what He hath wrought in us, for us, and through us. We have ourselves, either directly or indirectly, experienced multitudes of invaluable blessings, through the blood-purchased, spirit-sanctioned, and martyr-sealed Gospel of Christ.
