## DRY GOODS NEWS

(New York Times)

Another Price Increase

The furnishing goods dealers now have to face another advance on the well-advanced line of underwear. The old retail price of this article was \$1 and the wholesale price increase means that 33 cents more a garment will have to be asked from the consumer. As the price increase is made to all dealers and is communicated to the public through the medium of advertising, no trouble is expected to arise in getting the higher figure.

Good Ribbon Trade Furnished

Quite some little activity has featured transactions in the ribbon trade lately. The demand has held up production in some cases for three months. Orders have been confined almost strictly to the dry goods end, and wide goods have been chiefly asked for. Light and dark warp prints have featured operations and there has been quite some business placed on plaids. A tendency is noted toward Roman stripes. Low numbers have been especially popular.

Regimental Stripes to the Fore

With the growing popularity of the separate skirt, dress goods manufacturers have devoted more attention than usual this season to originating special designs for this branch of the apparel trade. One of the fabric styles that has been especially well received for next spring is the regimental stripe design. This consists of a group of three stripes in colors harmonizing with the background shade, separated by a space of two or three inches. The design is said to be particularly effective when used in skirts.

Lace Openwork Stockings Gone

The retailer of the better classes of women's hose, who has not got his season's supply of lace openwork goods that sell over the counter at \$3 to \$4 a pair, is due for a disappointment, especially so in view of the fine consumer demand for them that is reported. The largest producer of these goods is so oversold on them that it has been necessary to refuse all further orders, even for single pairs. "Frost" embroidered hose for women in the better qualities, are being touted as a big fall seller. They are offered mainly in black and white effects, in spray, floral, butterfly and other patterns though some of the so-called evening shades are included in the line. They retail from \$1.75 to \$10 a pair, and deliveries can be had in a week to ten days from the receipt of order.

Beads Are in a Boom State

If business was never booming before in the bead and spangle line, it is this season. Not only is the demand the heaviest leading factors in the trade have ever seen, but goods are about the accurate they have ever been. Steel beads are particularly in demand, and they are so hard to get that prices have advanced on them from 7 cents a small bunch to 19 cents or more. Cut steel beads are

especially scarce being in demand for trimmings on shoes, dresses, hats, gowns and other wearings apparel, and on velvet and crocheted bags. Seed beads in all colors, some 200 shades in all, are also much called for, many of the colors being hard to get now. Oriental and French pearl beads are much wanted for use in necklaces. In the spangles, jet and iridescent effects are in heavy demand for use on evening dresses. Prices on all kinds of beads now average 25 to 30 per cent. higher than normal.

Velour Hat Demand Growing

One of the features of the millinery trade of late has been the increase in the demand for velour hats, for outing wear in all the popular colorings. Velvet and hatters' plush shapes are still very much in the running, but are being used more for dress wear. All kinds of shapes seem to be moving, small and medium, straight brims, flares and mushrooms. Tans are doing well with the more popular priced trade. The output of velour hats is being hindered somewhat by the difficulty experienced in getting sufficient velvets in the most wanted shades, which include a variety of brown, navy, taupe, bottle green and wine. While purple is still a very popular color, it is said to be looking around a little in millinery lines in favor of brown, which is expected to be the best shade of all when the weather sets in a little cooler and furs come into general use.

DAD, 100, SPANKS SON, 60

"Youngster" Charged With Disorderly Conduct, Goes to Jail

William McCormick, 100 years old, of 46 Jefferson avenue, Elizabeth, N. J., had his gray-haired son, William McCormick, Jr., over sixty years old, taken to police court the other morning on a charge of disorderly conduct. The son immediately charged his father with assault.

"My boy," said the centenarian, who conducts a boarding-house in Elizabeth, "persisted in annoying the boarders. He continued after I had taken him across my knee and spanked him. He has always respected me till lately, when he thought my old age made me powerless to enforce obedience. He knows better now, and I want the court to uphold me."

Judge Owen P. Mahon sent William, Jr., to the county jail for five days.

It is no disgrace to be spanked by my father," the "youngster" told the judge, "but I wish he would relent and not compel me to go to jail for a boyish prank that he is too old to appreciate."

## Germany's Greatest Infamy

Writer Asserts Tubercular Prisoners Deliberately Mixed With Others in Secret Labor Camps—Accused of Purpose to Drag Down Rest of World With Her

New York, Sept. 26.—There have recently come into my possession copies of certain documents which have for their title "Indisputable Proof of Germany's Crime," says a cable from Paris to the New York Times. At present the acts therein alleged are forbidden publication in France, that the public mind may not become too greatly inflamed. They may not be published in France before the end of the war. But they already form part of the archives of the settlement after the war.

But it has been decided that they shall now appear in an English publication, and I am permitted to give them simultaneous publication through the New York Times to the neutral world. As the man who handed them to me said, "in their ugliness—with their blistering terror and truth—the neutral world may finally recognize how great a lie is every Berlin promise and how Germany has wilfully added a final infamy to her list greater than all her others."

The French government has accepted the verity of these documents, which are prefaced with the following statement: "This new crime is not like that directed against the women of Belgium. It differs from the murder of the Lusitania children. It is unlike the forcible removal of the civil population of Lille. It is entirely apart from the destruction of monuments. It is a deliberate thrust below the belt by a foe when he knows he is beaten. It is generated from the criminal idea that if Germany falls she will try to drag the world down with her. For this crime is not only against Frenchmen, Russians and Britons, but against every living man. It is perpetrated against the world."

Infection with Tuberculosis  
"This crime is that Germany is deliberately infecting her prisoners with tuberculosis. When the white scourge has sufficiently gripped them she casts them from her borders back to their own people or to neutral nations to breed contagion and to die. It is a gigantic manufactory, with living material. She already has 50,000 Frenchmen well inoculated, besides thousands or hundreds of thousands of men of other nations."

"Some time ago Germany promised to reform her method of treating prisoners. This followed a public outcry in neutral countries. She established 'show camps' where she now admits American and other neutral inspectors. Tuberculosis manufacture is carried on in other camps, secret camps—hundreds of them—known as labor camps, tucked away in

A majority of them are in salt, coal, and iron mines and in drainage and marsh reclamation areas. The stories of hundreds of tuberculars and doctors have all been checked one against another and all have been found to be true."

The report which follows this preface is the work of a woman—Mrs. Karen Bramson, a Danish author of note, also well known for her writings in France. She speaks many languages and received special facilities to pass weeks among the prisoners in Switzerland. The remainder of her information was supplied through French official sources.
