## ANOTHER LINE FOR CATTLE HERE

Jensen Steamers of England  
Announced as Coming  
for Business

Four Vessels to be Employed,  
With Accommodation For  
1,100 Head.

Another steamship line handling cattle will likely use this port during the coming winter season, according to word received from Ottawa last night. It is announced that the Jensen Shipping Line of England, as a result of negotiations with western cattle shippers, has had boats specially fitted for this trade. The first sailing of the service will be the steamer Frae Jensen from Quebec about Nov. 20. Another vessel is being rebuilt and two others are to be added, bringing four into this trade. They will be fitted to carry approximately 1,100 head of cattle each. All the ordinary cargo space is to be converted into cattle space. Livestock men in the west headed by H. P. Kennedy have pledged themselves to furnish cargo and arrangements have been made in the United Kingdom to dispose of the cattle on that side.

According to the report these vessels will use the port of Saint John during the coming winter.



## Fires Send Shellac Prices Upward

NEW YORK, Oct. 27.—Fire aboard the Stockwell and the City of Lahore, two ships with cargoes of shellac bound for this country, caused sharp advances in the prices of this product in the New York, London and Calcutta markets last week, says The Oil, Paint and Drug Reporter.

The Stockwell caught fire while at her coaling berth at Oran, Algeria, and the City of Lahore burned at her local pier.

The fire on the City of Lahore damaged 1,400 bags of badly needed shellac. Shellac blanchers and varnish makers had placed large contracts against the combined cargoes and their elimination caused a feverish and advancing spot market.
