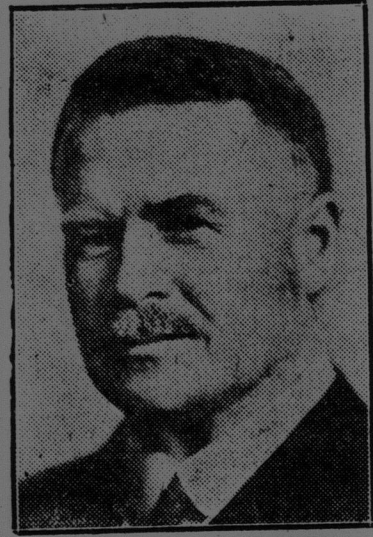


HON. DR. S. F. TOLMIE

One looked in vain for a lingering trace of the flapper influence as the manikins from house after house paraded by. It was gone even from the young girl styles, where curls have once more come into their own, replacing the bob.

Really small hats formed a negligible proportion of the show. Enormous picture hats with sweeping brims and trailing adornments which carried out the downward line so as often entirely to conceal the face on the right side, struck the keynote of the whole collection. Everything dropped, streamers, veils, big bows of same material as the hat and plumes, and yet more plumes, which in many instances reached far below the shoulders.
