HAVE BIG AIMS

Hamilton, June 13.—The report of the Committee of Fifty of the Presbyterian General Assembly set forth the Forward Movement as follows:
 (1) The doubling of the church's Budget for Maintenance in the next five years.
 (2) A Special Peace Thank Offering of \$400,000 as an Equipment and Extension Fund to meet the more immediate needs of the New Era. That amount is made up as follows:
 Home Missions and Social Service (including W. M. S.), \$1,700,000; Foreign Missions, \$600,000; the Foreign Mission Work of the Women's Missionary Society, \$200,000; aged and infirm ministers' fund, \$500,000; widows' and orphans' fund, \$200,000.
 Colleges—Westminster Hall, \$75,000; Robertson College, \$75,000; Saskatoon College, \$75,000; Manitoba College, \$50,000; Knox College, \$75,000; Queen's College, \$50,000; Montreal College, \$50,000; Halifax College, \$50,000.
 Board of Sabbath schools and Young People's Societies, \$400,000; missionary and deacons training home, \$300,000; Points-à-Trembles mission schools, \$20,000; deficits on foreign missions, P. C. aux-Trembles and aged and infirm ministers fund, \$60,000; to ensure an adequate current revenue during the raising of the equipment and extension fund, \$100,000.

FOREST FIRE LAWS

NOW APPLY TO C. N. R.

The provincial department of lands and mines has been notified that the Canadian National Railway have come under the control of the Railway Commission in the matter of protection of forest lands from fire. The minister of lands and mines, Hon. E. A. Smith, has endeavored to have the C. N. R. placed in the same position as privately owned railways as far as the protection of the forests from fire is concerned, and the announcement means that he has reached his goal.
 The West End Board of Trade met last evening and discussed the matter of the improvement of the water service. It was decided to call a general meeting of the citizens of Fairville and Lancaster to get them to take an active interest in the matter in order that the city council might be waited upon so soon as possible.

OLYMPIC BRINGS MANY

The Olympic docked yesterday afternoon at Halifax with the 88th Battalion, 2nd Division, 4th B. Co., 10th, 11th and 12th Engineers, 4th Division Train, Canadian Engineers' motor transport column and about 100 of the signal corps on board. General Kircaldy, C. M. G., D. S. O., was O. C. troops. Thirteen trains carried the troops from Halifax. Among the passengers was Lord Beaverbrook, who is in Canada for rest and recuperation, and also Sir William Weismann, an attaché of the British embassy at Washington, and Colonel Warburton, military attaché in Paris. Raymond Hitchcock, the actor, was also on board. The St. John soldiers on the Olympic included Capt. A. G. Rainnie, 12 Prince William street, and Pte. J. Paradis, 28 Dorchester street. Sailed on Scotia. Ninety-two officers, forty-five nurses and 1,605 men left England on the Scotia yesterday. This includes practically all the 6th Division Artillery, General Ralston and his staff are aboard. Units are for dispersal in Montreal, Toronto, Ottawa, Winnipeg and Vancouver.

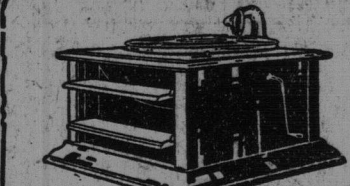

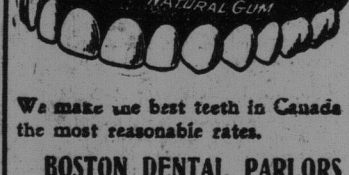
