Lansing Cable Chief Factor In Arrest of Caillaux

Former President of France Declared to Have Been in Communication With Berlin During War, for "Peace at Any Price"

Paris, Jan 15—The arrest of former Premier Caillaux was due principally to a cablegram from Secretary Lansing at Washington saying that in 1915, M. Caillaux had been in communication with the Berlin foreign office. Secretary Lansing's cablegram stated that the American representatives at tuenos Afres had been able to establish that M. Caillaux, during his visit to Argentina in 1915, had been in communication with the Berlin foreign office through Count Von Luxburg, the German minister to Argentina, with the object of concluding peace with Germany at any price, so as to permit the resumption of business.
