The failure of the king to reverse Lord Roberts' action was followed by another meeting of the officers of the brigade of guards at the Guards Club in Pall Mall to discuss the situation, and it was virtually decided that no occasion that might be caused by a ragging, despite all military regulations to the contrary, as the only means of riding the regiment of officers who are uncongenial and otherwise objectionable, and who are incapable of adapting themselves to the ancient traditions and ethics of the guards.

DARTMOUTH MAKING A BID FOR RAILWAYS

Ambitious Plan to be Placed Before Board of Trade Members

The practicability of a line of railway, independent of the main line of the I. C. R., to connect Dartmouth, N. S., with the two transcontinental railways that will soon terminate at Moncton, is the most important matter to be dealt with by the Dartmouth Board of Trade.

Very recently several members of the board discussed the project with W. C. Miller, well versed in railway matters. Mr. Miller drew attention to the fact that the C. P. R. had leased the N. B. Central Railway that runs from Norton, on the I. C. R., to Chipman, and from there to Minto, twenty miles distant, and that that road had also agreed to build a track forty miles, from Minto to Fredericton. This will probably be completed next year, when the C. P. R. main line will be connected with Chipman.

The C. P. R. possess running rights over the Transcontinental from Chipman to Moncton, so that in the near future both the Grand Trunk and C. P. R. will be in Moncton, and perhaps the Canadian Northern, if it proceeds with its scheme of building an independent line from Moncton across Maine to Chipman.

Mr. Miller suggests that a line from Moncton to Pugwash Junction, fifteen miles, a total of 118 miles. At the present time the line from Dartmouth to Dean Settlement via Glenarry Station. This would lead into Dartmouth where two or three transcontinental lines could find room for docks and warehouses. The grades that would be encountered in this route were also referred to as well as the distance. At the present time the line from Dartmouth to Dean Settlement is under contract—seventy-three miles—and the line from Scottdale to Pugwash Junction, fifteen miles, a total of 118 miles.
