ESKIMO LIFE. Eskimo government is very simple. Each tiny village is independent of all others, says the Kansas City Times. There is practically no tribe cohesion, and a head man of a village is recognized as an adviser rather than

a ruler.

Established cústoms have the force of law. Violations of these customs are punished by the person injured, or in case of murder by the nearest relative. They do little fighting. The bond of affection between parents and children is very strong.

Religion is simple animism, all animate and inanimate objects being invoked as delties. The Eskimos have a special deity in a supposed old woman of the sea, who presides over storms and sea animals.

Some villages believe in two souls, one which remains near a dead body until it enters that of a little child, and another which goes to the Eskimo land of souls, either above or below the earth.
