

MISS JOAN FOSTER BURSARY WINNER

Captures Moyse Traveling Scholarship Donated to McGill by Lord Atholstan.

Miss Joan Mary Vassie Foster, daughter of Hon. W. E. Foster, is one of the two clever students who have won this year the Moyse Traveling Scholarship donated to McGill University by Lord Atholstan in memory of the late Dean C. E. Moyse. The other winner is Merritt Elery Read, of Sherbrooke, Que.

The two Moyse Traveling Scholarships have a value of \$1,500 each and are awarded to graduates of McGill University in arts and science. The terms of the gift specify that each holder of the scholarship shall devote the period of tenure of the scholarship to advanced study, preferably in a British or a European university.

To Receive Degree.

The deed also provides that if a deserving applicant in one of these sections is not forthcoming both scholar-

ships may be awarded to applicants in either sections of arts or science. Miss Foster entered McGill in 1919 and graduated with honors in English in 1923. Since graduation she has acted as assistant to the warden at the Royal Victoria College on the resident staff. She also will receive the Master of Arts degree this year.
