No Key to Statues Of Easter Island

Systematic Exploration of Other Islands Yielded No Light on Mystery.

London, June 18.—(By Mail).—Mr. and Mrs. Scoville Routledge have recently returned from Easter Island, the lonely island in the Pacific, two thousand miles from the coast of Chile, with remarkable statues of a vanished race. They explained yesterday to a representative of The Times that, though the riddle of the statues remained unsolved, they had acquired a mass of valuable material about the ways, manner of life, customs, and habits of the people of the Gambier Islands.

The chief of these islands is Mangareva, and Mr. and Mrs. Routledge started this last expedition, which has occupied nearly two and a half years,

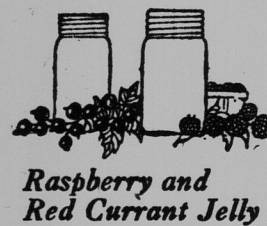
Preserve and Can while fruit is plentiful

Canning Cherries

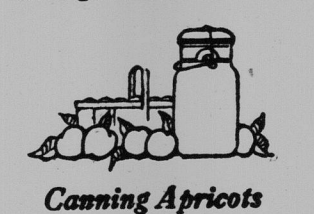
Choose fresh, sound fruit. Pick over, stem and wash in cold water. Put in jar and fill with boiling hot syrup made in the proportion of one pint sugar to two pints of water. Drain off surplus syrup. Place the jar in the water in the boiler about half-way up the jar. Water should be warm, not hot, when the jars are put in. Place lid on the boiler, bring to the boil and continue to boil or sterilize for 15 minutes. Seal according to directions given on page 11 of our recipe book.



Raspberry and Red Currant Jelly

Use equal quantities of raspberries and currants. Wash and bring slowly to the boil, simmering until soft. Drain overnight in jelly bag, measure the juice and return to the boiling point. Add sugar equal to the quantity of the juice. Boil from five to ten minutes testing on a cold plate until it gels. Pour into jars and stand in the sun for a day to harden. Seal.

Canning Apricots

Blanch for 1 to 3 minutes in boiling water, drain and cold dip. Remove skins and pips. Fill jars with boiling syrup made in the proportion of 1 pint of sugar to 1 1/2 pints of water. Sterilize for 15 to 20 minutes, and seal according to directions given on page 11 of our recipe book.

Civilian Veteran Of Indian Mutiny

Late W. M. Low Was Thanked By Queen Victoria For His Services.

London, June 15.—(By Mail).—One of the last survivors of the band of Indian civilians who did so much to keep the flag flying in the Indian

Mutiny, William Malcolm Low of Clatto, Fife, died yesterday in his eighty-eighth year.

He was the eldest son of General Sir John Low of the East India Company's forces, a famous political officer who negotiated the Treaty of 1833 with the Nizam of Hyderabad. His younger brother was general Sir Robert Low, who commanded the Chitral Expedition. On their mother's side also they were linked with one of the great Anglo-Indian families, for she was a daughter of Mr. John Talbot Shakespear of the East India Company's service. Receiving a nomination to that service, he was educated at Haileybury, at that time the seminary for the training of civilians, and went out to Bengal in 1856.

For his services in the field during the Mutiny which broke out in the following year he received a special letter conveying the thanks of Queen Victoria. He was one of the men selected to develop the Central Provinces, then in a most backward state, and he was Commissioner of the Nerbudda Division when ill-health compelled his retirement. He succeeded to the Clatto property in 1880, and was a J. P., and Deputy-Lieutenant for his county. In 1886 he was elected Unionist M. P. for Grantham, and held the seat until the 1892 General Election. He married in 1872 Lady Ida Matilda Feilding, daughter of the seventh Earl of Denbigh, and they had two daughters, one of whom is Lady Mount. She died in 1915.

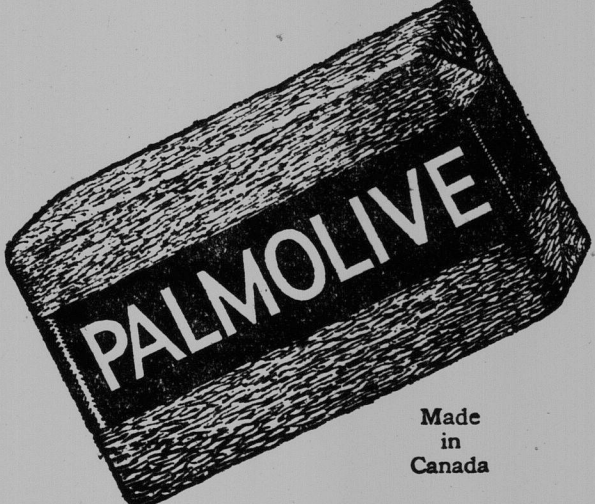
