"The situation in South Africa was aggravated by a policy of attaching relatives and special friends of the peo-ple controlling the mines, to lucrative out useless positions. For instance, consulting engineers are employed at abulous salaries, and the system of head workers is swelled to such an ex-ent that there is nothing left of the ines' productiveness for the miners of eating and sleeping in the company boarding-house. The money is swal-lowed up by the engineering staffs. The irecting staff is represented by the line manager, who is practically solely sponsible for the operation of the

Mr. Chick believes that the status of mining industry in South Africa vill improve with an improvement of ne status of the mining labor, and a eform of managing methods. He chinks there are many low grade prop-sitions there, not yet touched, which will eventually be developed at a profit.

Touching finally on the point that ere was connection between the quality of the ore and the labor conditions in the Johannesburg mines, Mr. Chick pointed out that the average cost of producing a ton of ore with coolie labor in South Africa was something like seventeen shillings. The cost of producing ore with white labor in Australia was between thirteen and fifteen nillings per ton.

There is a good future for South Af-ica, and Mr. Chick thinks its real progress will be hastened by the atesmanlike policy of the British government in granting self government t the colony. THE UNREST IN ZULULAND

Telegrams from Natal ann Telegrams from Natal announcing disquieting incidents, in the profince of Zululand show clearly that tranquility has not been completely restored.

It is perhaps more than a coincidence that the murder of Sitshitshili, the attempts to destroy a bridge and seize a mail carrier, the firing upon a white sergeant of police, have all taken place in what is known as the Nkandhla division. It was in this part of the country that the recent native rebellion was most virule.

It was in this part of the country that the recent native rebellion was most virulent, and the principal chief at that time, Sigananda, was sentenced to death for treason, but died in jail before the sentence was carried out.

One of the chief causes is doubtless to be found in the fact that a large number of the rebels from this district have recently been released from prison, and have returned to their kraals to play the role of malcontents.
