## EVERYTHING READY FOR TOURNAMENT

## BASEBALL DISPUTE

New York, Feb. 15.—It was stated that the cases of the Baltimore club of the federal league, which has a suit in court against organized baseball, is not involved in the settlement. **SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.**

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has since continued to be, a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, or Ontario. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Dues—Six months residence upon cultivation of land in each of three years.

In certain districts a homesteader may secure an adjoining quarter-section as pre-emption. Price \$5.00 per acre. Dues—Reside six months in each of three years after earning homestead in each of three years. Price \$5.00 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years. Cultivate 30 acres and erect a house worth \$500.00.

A settler after obtaining homestead patent if he cannot secure a pre-emption, may take a purchasing mortgage on the homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years. Cultivate 30 acres and erect a house worth \$500.00.

When Dominion Lands are advertised for pre-emption, returned soldiers who have served overseas and have been honorably discharged, receive one day priority in applying for entry at the Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency). Discharge papers must be presented to Agents.
