

Prince Edward Island Railway.

THIS Railway was opened for traffic in the summer of 1875, and is now in regular running order, being well supplied with new equipment, and offers every facility for tourists in the Summer season.

It is 200 miles long, and connects all the important places on the Island. At Souris and Georgetown it reaches the most easterly parts of the Island on the open sea, and passing through Charlottetown, the capital of the Island, proceeds by way of Summerside, Alberton and Tignish, the latter being the most westerly point on the Island.

The scenery of the Island is picturesque; the climate moderate and bracing in the hottest weather, and the sea-bathing and fishing both excellent.
