BILL.

An Act for the diminution of Sunday Labor in the Post Office Department.

HEREAS it is very desirable that persons em-Preamble. ployed in the service of the Post Office Department should be relieved as much as possible from the obligation to labor on the Lord's Day commonly called 5 Sunday, and that no desecration of the Sabbath should be permitted to take place by the performance of any unnecessary work in that Department on that Holy Day: Be it therefore enacted, &c.,

That from and after the season of navigation in this year Steamers not 10 of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, no to start with the Mail on mail shall be despatched by steamer from either of the Sundays. cities of Montreal, Kingston or Toronto on the Lord's Day, commonly called Sunday.

II. And be it enacted. That it shall be the duty of the Post Office to be closed on Sundays on or place in which it shall have been decided by a resolution of the Municipal Council thereof that the Post Office authority. therein shall not be opened for the delivery of letters on the Lord's Day, to close it and keep it closed for, and to 20 abstain from, the delivery of letters accordingly, from and after the time when a certified copy of such resolution shall be communicated to him by the proper officer of the Municipality.

III. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the Postmasters 25 Postmaster General to dismiss from office any Postmaster contravening dismissed. found guilty of evading or contravening any of the provisions of this Act.
