III. And be it further enacted by the authoty aforesaid, that it shall be the duty of the several Justices of the Peace to number and mark with their initials (Paraphé) the several leaves in the Register which they are hereby bound to provide themselves with, and keep for the purposes of this act.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall also be the duty of the aforesaid Justices of the Peace in all instances, where they shall take cognizance of, hear, try and determine any case according to law, within their Jurisdiction, to preserve a minute or memorandum of the evidence on either side, and mention the names of the several witnesses giving such evidence, to the end that in case of revision, before any superior Court, the evidence and matters of fact upon which the decision may have been given, may be manifest to such superior Court having the right to revise the same in case of complaint.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that all the Costs allowed in every such case, shall also be specified in such Register, as well as the day when Execution shall have been issued to levy such Costs and condemnation, and the day when the fine shall have been paid into the hands of such Justice of the Peace, pursuant to such condemnation.

VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the Justices of the Peace aforesaid, shall annually, in the month of August, transmit and pay over into the hands of the Clerks of the Peace in their respective Districts, the amount of all Fines and Penalties by them respectively levied and received; and shall at the same time furnish such Clerks of the Peace with a Statement, specifying the several offences for which, as well as the several Acts under which they have been so incurred and levied.

VII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be the duty of the Clerks of the Peace in the several Districts of this Province, on receipt of such Fines and Penalities, and Statements to accompany the same, to pay the amount of all monies so by them received, into the hands of the proper Officer or Officers, according to the direction of the several Acts under which the same have been incurred and levied as aforesaid, taking Duplicate Receipts therefor, one of which they shall transmit to the Inspector of Provincial Accounts.
