

Dixie Beehives hottest as homers

Beehives won their fourth straight Junior B hockey contest in the friendly confines of Dixie Arena Sunday night, whipping Etobicoke Nationals 7-3.

In seven league games this season, Dixie is unbeaten at home and have a win, a loss and a tie in their three games on the road.

Sunday's game was a rather dull affair as Bee-

hives led 4-0 after the first period and simply went through the motions in the final 40 minutes.

Needless to say, coach Frank Milne wasn't too happy with his team's let-down in the latter stages.

"That was bad hockey out there. We can't afford to have games like that.

"Some of the younger players have got to learn to go both ways. They think if they score a goal they've got it made. They don't! I've told them there's no sign out there that says 'One way only.'"

Milne was also disturbed by the refereeing in the game. He had good reason to be. Infractions were called almost as an afterthought and the head official and both linesmen were often in the wrong position to make accurate calls.

The referee really blew the duke in the second period during a three-ring fight. Dixie Goaler Leo Brett was the first of a number of players from both teams to become involved yet he escaped without any kind of penalty. The Queen's rules of ice

hockey (or whoever makes the rules) explicitly call for an automatic misconduct penalty to a goaler who leaves his crease to participate in a scrap.

Brett had his come-uppance a few minutes later when he was smothered in his crease by one Etobicoke player while another shot the puck into the net. The ref forgot his rule-book again and the goal was allowed to stand.

Vic Stanfield was the best player on the ice throughout. He scored one goal and set up two others with accurate passes after rink-long rushes.

Wayne Bowden, a skater whose opponents probably like to see arrested for speeding, scored two goals and set another by linemate Jim Glover.

Pat Differ, Glen Campbell and Gary Young added singles.

Mike Holowack with two goals and John Chandler hit for Etobicoke. Nats

scored two of their goals in the last two minutes of the game.
