been made, however, whereby any Continental, farming in Western Canada, who wants to bring a relative or friend to help him on the land, will be able to do so by nomination. This removes the possibility of criticism on the ground that we refuse the foreign born who are farming in Canada to have their friends join them and assist them on the land.

This year there was a noticeable increase in the movement of Continental families for land settlement. Many of these families had little or no capital. The increase was, no doubt, due to the fact that we had shut off a lot of the single men movement. In order to control this, instructions have been issued that the Continental family, unless coming by special nomination which will be investigated beforehand, must in addition to paying their own way, have a minimum capital of \$250 on arrival at destination.
