We have a threefold obligation—

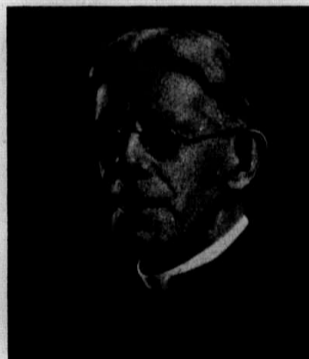
- (a) To maintain the Student Christian Movement in the University of Toronto. This requires approximately \$6,500 a year.
- (b) To assist in the maintenance of the Student Christian Movement of Canada and the Missionary Council, which co-ordinates similar work in 21 university centres in Canada. This requires \$3,800 a year.
- (c) To take our share in assisting the World's Student Christian Federation which has Christian work in the universities of 45 countries. This requires \$800 a year.
