

Ottawa, July 24th, 1941

Description of two portions of Boston Bar  
Indian Reserve No.2 (Kopchitchin) required  
for a right-of-way for the purpose of a road.

These two parcels of land lying on either side of the Canadian Pacific Railway in Kopchitchin Indian Reserve No.2 of the Boston Bar Band, Province of British Columbia required as a right-of-way for a road, and containing one acre and seventy-two hundredths of an acre, more or less, for the parcel west of the said railway and three acres and eight hundredths of an acre, more or less, for the parcel east of the said railway, as the said parcels are shown coloured pink upon a plan of the said right-of-way signed by O.B. Wilkie, British Columbia Land Surveyor, on the 4th day of July, 1940, that was filed in the Land Registry Office of the District under No.A889 on the 23rd day of October, 1940, a duplicate of which is of record number Rd.2917 in the Indian Affairs survey records, Department of Mines and Resources, Ottawa.
